ST. PATRICK AND CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

Revd Linda Cronin, writes:

As we continue our journey in Lent, we have St Patrick's Day on 17th March.

As most of you will know, we spent the previous 4 years before coming to Dawlish in Northern Ireland. On one occasion we spent the weekend of St Patrick's Day (being a



bank holiday) in Dublin and went to Downpatrick on St Patrick's Day itself. This was an experience of huge celebration. (It was also in Dublin where I had my first taste of Guinness!).

There are various folk stories about St Patrick but something that struck me is what he writes in the Confessio. In it Patrick tells of a dream, after his return to Britain, in which one Victoricus delivered him a letter headed "*The Voice of the Irish*". As Patrick read it, he seemed to hear a certain company of Irish beseeching him to walk once more among them. "*Deeply moved*," he says, "*I could read no more*." Nevertheless, because of the shortcomings of his education, he was reluctant for a long time to respond to the call. Even on the eve of his reembarkation for Ireland, he was beset by doubts of his fitness for the task. Once in the field, however, his hesitations vanished. Utterly confident in the Lord, he journeyed far and wide, baptizing and confirming with untiring zeal. (https://www.britannica.com/biography/Saint-Patrick)

There were a couple of things that struck me.

* His reluctance to respond to God's call due to the shortcomings of his education

But when He obeyed the Lord...

* His confidence in the Lord and his untiring zeal

I wonder if you can identify with Patrick?

Maybe there are times when you sense God maybe calling you to something and yet we can find so many reasons as to why not! And yet when we obey the Lord, we can know His confidence and His zeal!

During this time of Lent, maybe take time to listen to God, His gentle nudges or His gentle whispers, maybe as you pray, as you read the Bible, through something a friend says or something you hear through a sermon or a Lent group.

This prayer of St Patrick maybe of help.....

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort me and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend or stranger.



THANK YOU Paul Jones writes:

I'd like to start by saying a big thank-you to everyone who provides financial support to the Church. It doesn't matter how much or how little you give, it is all needed and is gratefully received, so thank you. I'd also like to thank those who give their time in so many ways, none of our Churches could continue to operate without our many volunteers, you are critical to the running of our Churches so thank you as well.

There are several ways in which you can give to St. Gregory's (or to any of the Churches in the Benefice), these include PGS (Parish Giving Scheme), Bank Standing Orders, Bank Transfers, Gift Aid envelopes or Cash. Don't forget that with PGS and Standing Orders you still remain in control of your giving and can vary the amount whenever you wish, the regular income the Church receives from these give us stability and allows us to pay our monthly bills. At St. Gregory's we also have a contactless card payment machine which, now that people are getting used to it, is being used increasingly. If you would like more information about ways in which to give please contact your local treasurer.

The building at St Gregory's currently faces a number of challenges, most immediate is the repair of the 4 pinnacles on the Church tower which have been weather eroded. We need to repair them before they become too dangerous and threaten to close the Church, and cost estimates so far range from £40,000 to £90,000. The Church windows are also in need of upkeep, current estimates are in the order of £30,000-£40,000. The Church heating is another challenge, it is over 35 years old and while it has been extremely reliable over the years we have recently had a couple of faults. It is also very costly to run (in 2023 our gas bill was £10,000) and doesn't really give the heat that we need, and the Church of England Carbon NetZero challenge means finding a suitable cost-effective replacement is daunting. Finally the Church roof has regular maintenance but we know that it is suffering from nail rot, no it's not painful but it does mean that tiles slip and let rain in so we probably need to re-roof, at least this can be done in stages to help us manage the bills.

With all that in mind I feel I ought to mention Legacies. Over the years we have received some very welcome and helpful legacies. If you feel you are able to leave one of your local Churches a little something in your will it could help maintain our Churches for future generations, and if you would like more information please contact your Churchwardens or treasurer.


If you are unable to come to the meeting but willing to help then please let Alex Pugh or myself know. Everyone can get involved in some way, and there will be much to do before the festival.
