Those who wandered round Dawlish Lawn and into the Marquee on Saturday 8th June at the 'Turn the Tide' Festival, were able to engage with a wide variety of stalls all focussing on eco concerns, international, national and local. We were there as well!

I was there as our Eco Champion, and with the help of Linda, Ceri, Janice Smith and Cath Chappell staffed a stall which gave information about Eco church and our bronze award commitments, as well as the story of Jonah and the Whale!





What did we do? We told people about Swap Shop, Toilet Twinning (via Tear Fund - is yours twinned?!), Garden Twinning (via Ripple Effect aka Send a Cow) which helps mitigate the effects of climate change in east Africa. We had a short Rubbish Quiz and a Carbon Quiz and were able to tell visitors from churches up country about the Eco Church scheme. There were details of the St Gregory's Churchyard project, Holcombe Garden and the planter at St Mary's Hall. And Cath, Ceri and Janice did a wonderful job engaging children in making an origami whale out of scrap paper!

NEW BISHOP OF EXETER ANNOUNCED

The new Bishop of Exeter will be the Rt. Rev'd Dr Mike Harrison. The announcement was made by Downing Street, after his appointment was approved by the King. Bishop Mike is currently the Suffragan Bishop of Dunwich in the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich. He succeeds Bishop Robert, who retired last September.



Bishop Mike said "I am delighted, excited, and honoured to become the Bishop of Exeter. Devon holds a special place in my heart and I'm looking forward to working with its amazing churches and their communities to share the gospel message of hope, joy and wonder that is the faith we have in Jesus Christ to transform lives and restore broken situations."

The bishop is married to Rachel, an Occupational Therapist, and they have four adult children. He was born in Bolton and is a passionate supporter of Bolton Wanderers football team, as well as being a beekeeper, keen cake baker and fan of live comedy.

THY KINGDOM COME CELEBRATION & BIG CHURCH FESTIVAL

The **'Thy Kingdom Come' celebration** service took place at Exeter Cathedral on Pentecost Sunday led by Bishop Jackie Searle. It was fantastic to join many from our Dawlish Coast Mission Community as over 550 people gathered to sing and pray together for 'Renovation and Transformation' in our world, our communities and our own lives.

The event main speaker was Canon Ruth Valerio who is an environmentalist, theologian and social activist. She is Global Advocacy and Influencing Director at Tearfund and also Canon Theologian at Rochester Cathedral and her talk focused on a vision to inspire and equip Christians to a whole-life response to poverty, helping build a movement that brings about lasting change on the issues that impact the poorest and most vulnerable. The music group was led by Executive Director for 'Christians in Politics', Andy Flannagan and we were treated to songs both familiar and new as we powerfully united together as Christians singing our socks off in the magnificent setting of Exeter Cathedral!

In addition to the Thy Kingdom Come celebration, also during May my father and I attended the annual **Big Church Festival** this was our first time at this event, and it didn't disappoint! Attracting 30,000 Christian festival-goers each summer, Big Church Festival is the largest Christian music festival in the UK. Held within the grounds of the beautiful Wiston Estate in West Sussex, it hosts a varied line-up of contemporary artists across 8 stages; including a main stage arena for headlining bands, platforms for emerging artists, a stage for the spoken word and a superb prayer tent.

Both the Saturday and Sunday evenings were experiences in their own right. By the time the headlining acts came on, the crowd was huge and dusk met with the stage lighting and created such a wonderful spiritual atmosphere. It was fun and enlivening and the event allowed me to feel at home within a like-minded community. As well as building up my faith - a truly wonderful experience. I think the festival has a place for everyone but there is something quite special about choosing to place yourself in a Christ-centred environment like this, where everybody's common ground is loving Jesus. With the motto "Celebrate All That Is Good", BCF is the feel-good festival for coming together as God's big family and I can thoroughly recommend it for all ages!
