

'LORD, I BELIEVE, HELP MY UNBELIEF.'

Revd. Patrick Parkes writes:

There is often an assumption that faith is absolute, either you have it or you don't! In fact, as the title quote suggests this is not always the case.

Unbelief can lurk in the minds of the most ardent and seemingly faith-filled disciples. This certainly was the case with those early Apostles during the days after the crucifixion. Despite repeated assertions by Jesus that death would not have the last word in the Easter story, we are told by Luke that the claims of the women that they had seen the risen Christ 'seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them' (Luke 24:11).



So, it was not just 'doubting Thomas' who had a crisis of faith, almost all of the disciples at one point or another struggled to accept the testimony of the women who visited the tomb on that Easter morn.

At the end of Mark's Gospel we are told that Jesus chided the remaining eleven for their stubborn refusal to believe the account of the women and that of others, who Jesus appeared to on their way out of Jerusalem that same day.

We are also told that when, that evening, he showed himself to the disciples in the upper room 'in their joy they were (still) disbelieving and wondering.' All needed him to explain again the story of redemption and the purposes of God and to be repeatedly reassured that he was indeed amongst them in his resurrected form. The physicality of the resurrection was repeatedly reinforced, Thomas was invited to touch Christ's wounded body, the women clung on to him and he frequently ate meals with them; in Emmaus, in the upper room and by the sea of Galilee.

So it is permissible, during this Christian festival, to both confidently sing the Easter anthems that attest to the resurrection and yet still have moments of doubt. This is not evidence of our lack of faith but part of our journey of faith.

There will be times when the reality of Christ's resurrected presence is hard to grasp. On such occasions may we, like those early disciples, find consolation in God's forbearance and be reassured by his acceptance of the measure of faith we have, and his willingness to meet us where we are.

ST. GREGORY'S APCM REMINDER: Are you being called to serve?

The annual church meeting will be taking place on **Sunday 11th May after the morning service**. Each year we elect 4 new PCC members to serve for 3 years and 2 wardens who will serve for one year. Nominations need to be submitted before the meeting with a proposer and seconder for each candidate. Forms are available in the Narthex. These cannot be done electronically!

In the meantime perhaps you could think about whether this is a way you could serve the church. Meetings are held once every other month and thanks to modern technology reports can be circulated before to cut down on the meeting times. We therefore usually finish within $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

It is your chance to have a say on what happens at St Gregory's, being involved in major and minor decisions running the building and events, how money is spent and which projects are tackled first. No previous knowledge of committees, business or finance is required. The only qualification you need is to be on the electoral roll.
