"FOR THOSE IN PERIL ON THE SEA?"

Revd E. Patrick Parkes, Minister at St Paul's, Starcross writes:

On Sunday 23rd June, Churches up and down the Devon coastline with a strong maritime connection observed Sea Sunday, when they traditionally remembered seafarers and their families.

Coincidentally, in the gospel reading for that Sunday we are told the story of Jesus stilling the storm on the Sea of Galilee. (not really a sea at all but a large inland fresh water lake). Both events remind us of the unpredictability and dangers of 'a life on the ocean waves'. The hymn referenced in this reflection's heading is an iconic piece that is invariably sung on Sea Sunday.

The words of the second verse are:

Oh Christ whose voice the waters heard and hushed their raging at Thy word. Who walkest on the foamy deep and how amidst the storm did sleep. O hear us when we cry to Thee for those in Peril on the sea.

It is likely that most of those reading this article do not have the close affinity that those early disciples had with the sea, at least four of whom were fishermen by trade, before Christ called them. However, it is probable that many of us at one time or another have been buffeted by the storms of life and may have felt so overwhelmed by life's circumstances that we were in danger of drowning. The storms may come suddenly and unexpectedly as was the case with Jesus's disciples and be so tumultuous that, like these seasoned fishermen, we begin to believe that we likewise might perish. We also might believe, as they did, that Jesus is either oblivious or indifferent of our plight. Asleep as he was in the back of the boat, as it were!

Yet impressions can be deceptive. Christ was not indifferent to the disciples needs but rather wished to teach them that, despite appearances to the contrary, God was present and in control. In speaking to the winds, he was able not only to still the raging storm but also calm their fearful hearts. As the tempest abates, He gently reproves them for their lack of trust in his ability to preserve them in their time of trouble. There is nothing wrong about crying out in times of need, indeed it is sometimes both helpful and necessary. The support of others can be crucial in getting us through moments when we feel completely overwhelmed.

Rather it was the belief that others didn't care about them that was the problem. We too can live under the misapprehension that we have to weather the storms on our own when we are in fact surrounded by those who, if they only knew of our difficulty, would be more than willing to stand alongside us. Speaking words of peace and comfort into our lives. When we despair of finding solutions to our tempests, may we realise that there is someone we can turn to for help, and sometime that help comes in the guise of others who are similarly willing to lend a hand.

So Lord, 'hear us when we cry to thee..." in our times of peril or need, whatever form that might take.
