One thing really impacted me many years ago. We were part of organising a huge outreach event across London. We were responsible with other leaders for our area in West London. One of the Church leaders from another Church, took the time at the end of the day to say thank you to EVERYONE, not just the ones everybody would've seen being active, but those too who others may not have noticed. This has stuck with me throughout my ministry.

There is an opportunity to complete the Domestic Abuse safeguarding course face to face in Dawlish on Tuesday



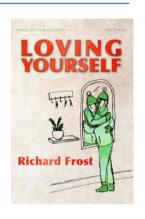
30th September at 2pm. This is for people who have responsibility within the church, such as PCC, DCC or leaders of groups or activities.

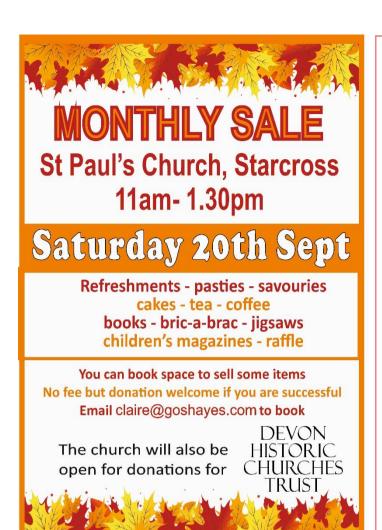
NEW BOOK: LOVING YOURSELF by Richard Frost
