

BIBLE SUNDAY Will Halse writes:

This Sunday, October 26th is not only the Sunday the clocks go back an hour, but also Bible Sunday. A day to celebrate the gift of God's written word. I want to use this letter to encourage you to read the Bible. The Bible is really a small library. It has 66 books – 39 in the Old Testament (before Jesus) and 27 in the New Testament (after Jesus). None of the books are very long; and some are very short. Each book is divided into chapters and



verses. So, for example, John 1:14 refers to verse 14 in chapter 1 in the gospel of John. It's a wonderful verse but it does need an explanation... The Word is Jesus, and John wrote his gospel to help us to see and believe in Jesus!

I have devised a short quiz to give you a taste of what the Bible says. For each question I have given the Bible book, chapter and verse, that has the answer. That's because I would like you dig into the Bible, and look up the answer, even if you think you know it already! If you don't have a Bible at home you can easily search for the Bible passages on the internet. For a translation in simple English try the Good News Translation. If you love language you will enjoy the King James Version! Here goes...

- ❖ In the creation story, what was the first thing that God created? Genesis 1:3
- ❖ How does the Bible say you should treat foreigners? Leviticus 18:33,34
- ❖ Before Israel entered the land of Canaan Joshua sent two spies to Jericho. What was the name of the prostitute in Jericho who hid the Israelite spies? *Joshua 2:4-6*
- ❖ The book of Ruth is a wonderful story of love and commitment. Ruth was a woman from Moab, a young widow, who came to live in Bethlehem. She married Boaz, a relative of her first husband and they had a son. What was his name, and who was his famous grandson? Ruth 4:16-17
- ❖ In the sermon on the mount where did Jesus say your heart will be? *Matthew 6:21*
- What clothing does Paul recommend in his letter to the Christians in Colosse? Colossians 3:12-14
- ❖ James warns Christians against something that is full of deadly poison? What is he talking about? James 3:8

Since I was a child I have been encouraged to read a short passage from the Bible every day. I use Bible reading notes that give me a passage to read and also a short reflection to help apply it to my life. I don't manage every day, but I feel it is important to keep going and not to give up. There are many Bible aids available now – just ask a friend or search the internet or even AI will help!! A little library of God's love - let's celebrate the Bible this Sunday and every day.


