Richard Orr (Licensed Lay Minister) writes:

I've been reflecting on one of the readings appointed for Sunday 20 October, (the 21st Sunday after Trinity in our Church calendar). Mark 10:35-45 recounts an exchange between Jesus and two of his disciples, James and John, who ask to sit at Jesus' right and left hand in his glory. Jesus responds by challenging their understanding of greatness, stating that true greatness

is found not in power or privilege but in serving others and sacrifice. He emphasises that the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

This passage invites us to reflect deeply on the nature of Christian leadership and community life. Many churches today face issues of dwindling numbers, social relevance, and the challenge of adapting to modern life while remaining faithful to the Gospel. Here Mark speaks directly to these concerns by pointing to the heart of our Christian identity: the call to humble service.

For this Benefice, navigating the complexities of modern British society, where individualism and success are often measured by status and material wealth, Jesus' radical redefinition of greatness offers a counter-cultural vision. In South Devon, with its mix of rural traditions and urban challenges, the temptation to focus inwardly, preserving church life as it has always been, can be strong. However, Jesus' teaching calls believers to move outward in service to their neighbours, seeking the welfare of the community over institutional self-preservation.

This passage also speaks to our clergy and lay ministers. As they seek to guide us in mission, they are reminded that authority in the Christian context is not about power but about service. They are not called to wield influence over their congregations but to serve alongside them, embodying Christ's self-giving love.

For all of us Mark 10:35-45 challenges a passive, consumerist approach to faith. Rather than attending church solely for personal spiritual nourishment, we Christians are called to active participation in God's mission, serving one another and the wider world. Whether in outreach to the marginalized, involvement in social justice, or simple acts of kindness, the model of a serving leadership Jesus presents, offers a blueprint for life that in our Benefice is vibrant, outward-looking, and rooted in the love of God.

It calls each of us to embody a sense of service that reflects Christ's example, transforming our community by prioritising humility, compassion, and self-giving.


